Vertebrate: has bones.

Reptile: cold blooded; lays eggs; has scales.

Habitat: central and southern North America. Often found in corn fields, hence the name.

Eats: small mammals such as mice and rats.

Fascinating Facts:

They are most active at night or in the hours of dawn and dusk.

They are mainly ground-dwellers, but some can be found living in trees.

Hatchlings range in size from 22-36 cm; adults are generally 76-152 cm in length.

They can lay up to 30 eggs in a clutch.
