Clay creations

Using clay and natural materials to create a new woodland creature, using descriptive language to describe its body parts

EYFS

Early learning goals: Communication and language, Expressive arts and design

Activity type: individual or group with an adult

Length of activity: 20 minutes

Outdoor requirements: playground with a few trees or local park

Resources: prepared balls of clay, natural materials



Starter activity:

Ask the children what parts their woodland creatures face might have, e.g. eyes, nose, mouth. Which natural materials could you use?

Main activities:

Either individually or in a group with an adult, children make their woodland creatures face either on the ground or on a tree trunk and collect natural materials to use for different parts.



Plenary activity:

Ask children to invent a name for their woodland creature and describe their different body parts, e.g. long pointy nose or glowing green eyes.



Specific risk asessment

Prior to the activity, check the area for litter.
