

# Woodland fairy crown

Using natural materials create a crown to wear and children perform a crowning ceremony for each of the fairies

## EYFS

**Early learning goals:** Communication and language, Expressive arts and design

**Activity type:** individual/group with an adult

**Length of activity:** 30 minutes

**Outdoor requirements:** playground with a few trees or local park

**Resources:** cardboard for crowns, double sided tape, range of natural materials, sticks for magic wands

### Starter activity:

Go to woodland/a tree. Tell the children that they are going to be the woodland fairies that look after the tree/trees in the woodland. They are going to make a crown and come to a crowning ceremony for all the woodland fairies.



### Main activities:

Give children a piece of cardboard with double sided sticky tape on and attach it together so it fits their head. Ask children to collect woodland materials to stick onto their crown.

Children need to collect a magic wand to make a wish for the forest so that they can become a woodland fairy.

### Plenary activity:

By the tree, or in the woodland, gather all groups of children for the crowning ceremony. Ask them to tell the class their wish for the forest and put their crown onto their head.

### Specific risk assessment

Prior to the activity, check the area for litter.
